

INSTRUCTIONS

The calendarwheel is a circular slide-rule perpetual calendar. Its valid range is from the year 1 AD to the year 7500AD. Its display is in the conventional United States format where Sunday (the last day of the week) is on the left and Monday (the first day of the week) is second from left. The calendarwheel not only tracks the seven-day cycle that is the common week but also tracks the 14 day cycle that often governs payroll and trash collection (red-week/blue-week).



To use the calendarwheel, simply align the first two and last two digits of the year in the inner white area. Find the calendars for each month in that year in the outer black area. [For January and February, one must refer to the color of the last two digits of the year to determine which of the colored columns to use (either red or blue). When the last two digits of the year are black, refer to the color of the first two digits of the year instead.] [During the 15, 16, and 1700's, one must specify OS (Old Style, Julian Calendar) or NS (New Style, Gregorian Calendar).]
